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#### **Definitions**

- "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- "Graduates Unavailable for Employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the
  applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the
  institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an
  examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first
  examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- "Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year"
- "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- "Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- "Salary" is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.
- "No Salary Information Reported" is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.



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#### STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

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**STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL:** You have the right to cancel this enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. THE DATE BY WHICH YOU HAVE TO CANCEL IS: \_\_\_\_\_\_ The College's Refund Policy is stated below. If a student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds. The procedures that a student is required to follow to cancel this Agreement or withdraw from the College and obtain a refund are stated below.

**REFUND POLICY:** The College complies with the California state mandated refund policy. This refund policy is applied to all terminations for any reason, by either party, including student decision, program or program cancellation, or College closure. All refunds will be calculated based on the student's last day of attendance. Any monies due shall be refunded within 45 days of official cancellation or withdrawal. Official cancellation or withdrawal shall occur on the earlier of the dates that:

- a) An applicant is not accepted by the College. The applicant shall be entitled to a refund of all monies paid.
- b) A student can cancel, without penalty, on or before the 7<sup>th</sup> business day following the first day of regularly scheduled instruction. In this case he/she shall be entitled to a refund of all monies paid to the College less the \$100 enrollment deposit.
- c) A student notifies the College of his/her withdrawal in writing.
- d) A student is terminated from the College.
- e) A student on an approved Leave of Absence notifies the College that he/she will not be returning. The date of withdrawal shall be the earlier of the date of expiration of the Leave of Absence or the date the student notified the College that he/she will not be returning.
- f) For official cancellations (paragraphs b, c, and d) and official withdrawals, the cancellation/withdrawal date will be determined by the postmark on the written notification, or the date said information is delivered to the College in person. The written notification need not take any particular form, however expressed; it is effective if it shows that you no longer wish to be bound by the enrollment agreement.

For students who enroll and begin classes but withdraw prior to program completion (after seven calendar days of signing the enrollment agreement or through attendance at the first regularly scheduled class session), the following schedule of tuition earned by the College applies. You have the right to withdraw, in writing, from a program of instruction at any time. All refunds are based on scheduled hours.

Any monies due to a student who withdraws shall be refunded within 45 days of a determination that a student has withdrawn, whether officially or unofficially. Unofficial withdrawals are monitored weekly and a determination is made to withdraw a student who has been absent for fourteen (14) consecutive calendar days. In the case of disabling illness or injury, death in the student's immediate family or other documented mitigating circumstances, a reasonable and fair refund settlement will be made.

**Equipment Policy:** Monies paid for equipment is non-refundable unless a student cancels or withdrawals from his/her enrollment and returns the equipment and/or books within seven (7) calendar days of the first regularly scheduled class session and the items are unopened and unused.

If permanently closed or no longer offering instruction after a student has enrolled, the College will provide a pro rata refund of tuition to the student; OR provide Program completion through a prearranged Teach-Out Agreement with another institution.

If the Program is cancelled subsequent to a student's enrollment, the College will either provide a full refund of all monies paid or completion of the program at a later time. If the Program is cancelled after students have enrolled and instruction has begun, the College shall provide a pro rata refund for all students transferring to another school based on the hours accepted by the receiving school; OR provide completion of the Program; OR participate in a Teach-Out Agreement; OR provide a full refund of monies paid.

**RETURN OF TITLE IV FUNDS:** A Financial Aid recipient terminating their program of study after entering the institution and before completing at least 60% of the payment period, the statutory Return of Title IV policy will be implemented (see student catalog for refund policy). Any monies owed to the College must be paid on or before 30 days from the date of withdrawal, or the balance will be referred to a collection agency. If a student is owed a refund, the refund will be made no later than 45 days from the date of withdrawal.

**FINANCIAL AID CALCULATION:** The College will calculate the amount of Financial Aid that was earned based on a payment period.
